What is the Funding Information Center?

A Cooperating Collection for the Foundation Center in New York City, the State Library's Funding Information Center maintains an extensive collection of materials on grant-getting and nonprofit management.

The Center assists individuals and nonprofit groups in using these materials and answers brief questions by telephone. We will loan books from the collection; however, we are unable to recommend specific funding sources. Grant seekers must do their own grants research.

You can find the answers to questions such as:

- How do I find grants for my field of interest?
- How do I locate grant makers in my city, state or region?
- How do I look for more information on specific foundations?
- What types of information will grant makers themselves provide?
- How do I secure a tax exemption?
- What should be in a grant proposal?
- What grants are available for individuals?
