

# **State Librarian's Update September 2023**

It was such a pleasure to learn that the State Library's Talking Book and Braille Center, New Jersey's regional library of the National Library Service for the Blind and Print Disabled (NLS), received the Regional Library of the Year 2023 distinction from the Library of Congress. The award is a recognition of the myriad of creative ways that staff are connecting with patrons – which range from telephone service (English and Spanish), to online book clubs (English and Spanish) and the Library Equal Access Program (LEAP) in partnership with public libraries across the state – so that all may read. The services provided also reflect a strong partnership with the state's Commission for the Blind and Visually Impaired (a division of the New Jersey Department of Human Services) which bolsters services. Please join me in congratulating the staff of our TBBC for this award.

The State Library is working with the state's Office of Broadband Connectivity to gather data for the state's Digital Equity Plan, which is currently being developed. We are hosting an online listening session on September 19 at 1pm that will focus on the needs, challenges and barriers of people with disabilities in using the internet, accessing technology and learning digital literacy. #### Northeast Summit on Climate Adaptation for Library Facilities

In partnership with Northeast State Libraries: New Jersey, New York, Connecticut, Rhode Island, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Vermont, and Maine, this kick-off summit is the first joint partnership of all Northeast State Libraries in support of adaptive resilience solutions for libraries facing the effects of climate change to their buildings and communities.
