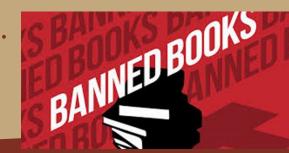




• *Intellectual Freedom:* is the right of every individual to both seek and receive information from all points of view without restriction.

 Challenge: is an attempt to remove or restrict materials, based on the objections of a person or group.

• Banned: is the removal of those materials.



Censorship by the Numbers



Books are being challenged throughout New Jersey and around the country of which 48% is targeted at public libraries.

2022 US Challenges by the numbers:

- **1,269** reported attempts to ban or restrict library resources.
 - **2,571** unique titles were targeted. 38% increase from 2021

Collection Development

• Library collection development is the process of systematically building the collection of a particular library to meet the information needs of the library users in a timely and economical manner.









Why do you need a collection development policy?

- Protects against challenges.
- Ensures materials reflect the library's mission and guiding principles.
- Provides a framework for consist selection in all formats.
- States who is responsible for selection.
- Ensures a diversity of viewpoints.

- Provides standard for collection maintenance and removal of material.
- Guideline for gifts and donations.
- Process for patrons to share concerns about library resources.
- Affirms the importance of intellectual freedom; First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution, the Library Bill of Rights and the Freedom to Read Statement.

Why do you need a procedure?

- Establishes a plan of action.
- Ensures consistency.
- Assigns responsibility.









Components of a Good Procedure

- Establish a review committee / team leader.
- Evaluation form.
- Provides a timeframe.
- Decides how/who will notify patron.

Staff Suggestion Card

- Maintain neutral body language
- Listen sympathetically and use active listening skills.
- Acknowledge the stress and discomfort they may feel.
- Offer alternative options.
- Explain the collection development policy.
- If resolution from above options is not met, offer the reconsideration form.
- Call and notify your supervisor.
