## **Stay Informed:**

#### Digitization Projects

NJSL's Research Library has met a milestone in the number of pages digitized both in-house and through a vendor. This work is being funded with both federal and state funds. More than 1 million pages have been digitized since the summer of 2023 as part of the "Telling New Jersey's Untold Stories" project partially funded by the National Archives and Records Administration. Librarians are slowly going through all the resulting digital documents and applying metadata to support discovery in our New Jersey State Publications Digital Library. This project will continue for several years to come.

#### Historic Documents on Tariffs

With the continual discussion of tariffs in today's news, researchers may be interested in reading a speech given by a New Jersey Republican Congressman, Hon. Charles N. Fowler, back in April 1909 when he spoke before the Tariff Commission. The title of his speech was "Tariff Changes by Evolution and Not by Revolution" and is available through the <a href="New Jersey State Publications Digital Library">New Jersey State Publications Digital Library</a>. There are several other historic and contemporary state documents that address tariffs that can be found in this digital library.

#### **Updated Research Guides**

In response to current events, we recently updated our <u>Get Help: New Jersey Social Services</u> research guide with additional information on <u>Immigration</u>. This guide offers information on a variety of topics impacting people across the state. Additionally, we added a new section to our <u>U.S. Government</u> research guide called <u>Archived Federal Websites and Data</u>, to help users navigate changes made to federal government websites and data portals since the 2025 presidential transition.

### TBBC's Winter Reading Program

NJSL's Talking Book & Braille Center had over 40 participants in this year's 2025 Chilly Chapters Winter Reading Challenge. A total of 955 books were read this year; an increase from last year's 800 books. Each participant got a pair of gloves with the TBBC logo, eight book lists created by TBBC staff, and at least one chance to win a \$100 Visa Gift Card. Erica Edelman won the gift card. A tactile chess set was also presented to Laurie Neidhart, for reading the most books! The prizes were provided by the Friends of the Library.

#### NLS Visit

On March 10th and 11th, MaryBeth Wise and Henry Malone from the National Library Service for the Blind and Print Disabled, Library of Congress visited TBBC. During this visit, MaryBeth and Henry met with TBBC staff about our current programs and patron outreach.

#### Palace Project Update

The list of Palace Project <u>participating libraries</u> has been updated; the Otto Bruyns Public Library of Northfield is the latest addition. Participation has continued to increase as well with 3,820 new NJ patrons having signed up for Palace Project access since January 1, 2025.
