

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NOTICES OF RULE-MAKING ACTIVITIES OF STATE AGENCIES

AGRICULTURE

STATE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE

Proposed Amendments Concerning Fruit and Vegetable Inspection and Grading

The State Board of Agriculture, pursuant to authority of N.J.S.A. 4:10-3, proposes to amend a portion of its rules concerning fruit and vegetable inspection and grading.

Full text of the proposal follows (additions indicated in boldface thus; deletions indicated in brackets [thus]):

2:71-2.28 Charges for inspection or grading and certification services; written agreements

(a) Charges for inspection or grading and certification services of five or more consecutive days duration, performed pursuant to a written agreement between the New Jersey Department of Agriculture and the requestor of the services, shall be made according to the following schedule:

1. Basic schedule for all products:

i. A charge of \$290.00 per five day week (Monday through Friday) of 40 hours or less for each inspector;

ii. [An additional] A charge of \$10.88 per hour, or portion thereof, for all hours worked over 40 in the five day week (Monday through Friday), or for all hours over eight hours per day;

iii. [An additional charge of \$10.88 per hour, or portion thereof, for each inspector working on Saturdays or Sundays. There will be a four hour minimum charge for each inspector required to work on Saturday and similarly a four hour minimum charge for each inspector required to work on Sunday;]

There will be at least a four hour minimum charge or \$43.52 assessed for each inspector assigned work on Saturday and/or Sunday;

iv. [An additional] A charge of [\$5.00] \$12.25 per hour, or portion thereof, for the actual hours worked by each inspector on legal State holidays occurring Monday through Friday;

v. Official mileage will be charged at the prevailing State rate [of \$0.16] per mile, starting and ending where the inspector officially reports for duty.

2. [Additional charges] Charges for inspection or grad-

ing and certification of fruit and vegetables other than potatoes for the fresh market:

i. [An additional] A charge of \$0.02 will be made for all packages inspected or graded and certified in excess of [4,835] 4,140 packages during the seven day week (Saturday through Friday).

3. [Additional charges] Charges for inspection or grading and certification of potatoes for the fresh market:

i. A charge of \$0.03 per hundredweight for all hundredweights inspected or graded and certified in excess of [4,145] 3,625 [pounds] hundredweights during the seven day week (Saturday through Friday).

2:71-2.29 Charges; oral agreements; trailer, car, warehouse and storage lots

(a) Charges for inspection or grading and certification services performed pursuant to an oral agreement between the New Jersey Department of Agriculture and the requestor, for all trailer, car, warehouse and storage lots, shall be made according to the schedule detailed below. A minimum of [\$10.00] \$11.00 for inspection or grading and certification services shall be charged. However, if the conditions listed in N.J.A.C. 2:71-2.30 are met, the charges shall be calculated according to the hourly rate schedule set out in N.J.A.C. 2:71-2.31.

1. Basic charge schedule for products other than cranberries or potatoes:

i. A charge of [\$0.03] \$0.035 per container for all containers not exceeding 20 pounds or 12 quarts;

ii. A charge of [\$0.06] \$0.07 per container for all containers exceeding 20 pounds or 12 quarts.

2. Basic charge schedule for cranberries:

i. A charge of \$0.10 for each hundred pound container [barrel equivalent];

ii. A charge of \$0.05 for each 48 or 50 pound container (½ barrel equivalent);

iii. A charge of \$0.025 for each 24 pound container or 25 pound container (¼ barrel equivalent);

iv. All other size containers shall be converted to hundredweight equivalents. Charges for these equivalents shall be at the rate of \$0.10 per [hundredweights] hundredweight.

3. Basic charge schedule for potatoes:

i. A charge of [\$0.07] \$0.08 per hundredweight;

ii. All other size containers and bulk loads shall be converted to hundredweight equivalents. Charges for these equivalents shall be at the rate of [\$0.07] \$0.08 per hundredweight.

4. Phytosanitary certificates:

i. No charge will be made for such certificates;
ii. The Chief, Bureau of Commodity Inspection and Grading, Division of Regulatory Services, may be contacted for information on countries requiring additional declaration statements.

5. Delayed Inspections: Delayed inspections are those inspections requiring more than two hours to complete (exclusive of travel time) due to delays of any kind not attributable to the inspector. Additional charges for delayed inspections shall be assessed according to the following schedule:

i. [An additional charge of] \$6.00 per hour[;], in half hour increments.

[ii.] [The minimum charge shall be \$3.00.]

2:71-2.30 Charges; oral agreements between Department of Agriculture and requestor

(a) Charges for inspection or grading and certification services performed pursuant to an oral agreement between the New Jersey Department of Agriculture and the requestor[,] shall be made according to the hourly rate schedule set out in N.J.A.C. 2:71-2.31 when:

1. A restricted inspection of large lots is to be made and the requestor asks that the certificate show the total count or volume of the lot;

2. A requested inspection is not completed for any reason whatsoever not attributable to the inspector or when an inspection is incomplete and no official certification is issued;

3. A requested inspection involves bulk or bin lots of products, except cranberries or potatoes.

2:71-2.31 Hourly rate charges

(a) The hourly rate charges shall be made according to the following schedule:

1. A charge of [\$10.00] \$11.00 per hour, or portion thereof, for regular work hours, 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M., on regular workdays, Monday through Friday;

2. A charge of [\$15.00] \$16.50 per hour, or portion thereof, for work started or completed between 6:00 P.M. and 7:00 A.M. on regular workdays, Monday through Friday;

3. A charge of [\$15.00] \$16.50 per hour, or portion thereof, for work performed on Saturdays, Sundays, or legal State holidays at the request of the requestor.

Proposed Rules Concerning Savings Banks' Deposits

Angelo R. Bianchi, Commissioner of Banking, pursuant to authority of N.J.S.A. 17:9A-184C(e), proposes to adopt new rules concerning savings banks' deposits.

Full text of the proposal follows:

SUBCHAPTER 8. SAVINGS BANKS; DEPOSITS

3:6-8.1 Mortgage closing accounts

Deposit accounts, established or increased through internal transfers, which are to be used exclusively to facilitate the distribution of mortgage loan proceeds may exceed the \$150,000.00 maximum deposit limitation prescribed in N.J.S.A. 17:9A-184C. Internal accounting procedures should be established to clearly identify the portions of such deposit accounts applicable to each related mortgage loan.

Amendments to State Service Personnel Manual Concerning Compensation

On January 25, 1980, the New Jersey Civil Service Commission, pursuant to authority of N.J.S.A. 11:5-1 and in accordance with applicable provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act, adopted amendments to subpart 7-1.101 in the Civil Service Personnel Manual (State Service) concerning compensation.

Full text of the adoption follows.

Part 7-1 Compensation

Subpart 7-1-101 Titles Designated as NL4

7-1.101a Subject:

This subpart is issued to provide information concerning the provisions approved by the Civil Service Commission for individuals in NL (hours not limited) titles who supervise 40 hours per week employees.

7-1.101b Policy:

The Civil Service Commission approved the following changes in the compensation plan, effective June 22, 1974 (Salary Administration Memorandum No. 3-75):

"Effective June 22, 1974, salary ranges assigned to titles whose duties include supervision of employees in titles assigned a 40 hour work week will be allocated to ranges that are one range higher in the Pay Schedule than that range to which the job evaluation points convert, the same as if they were 40 hour week titles. . . . Such titles will be designated in the Compensation Plan as NL4."

7-1.101c Application:

In accordance with the above policy, there is one condition to be met for a title to be designated as NL4. That condition is that the duties of the title require the incumbent(s) to work regularly at least a 40 hour week in order to directly supervise employees on a regular and continuous basis in titles assigned to a 40 hour work week.

7-1.101d Procedure

An Appointing Authority may request that a NL class title be designated NL4 by submitting a written request to the Director, Division of Classification and Compensation. Upon receipt of the request, a review of the specific reasons for such designation shall be made and an investigation may be made, if necessary. If the request is not supported by the facts the Appointing Authority shall be promptly notified. If the request is justified the Director of Classification and Compensation shall forward a recommendation to the Chief Examiner and Secretary who may submit it to the Civil Service Commission for consideration.

An order adopting these amendments was filed and became effective on February 1, 1980 as R.1980 d.59 (Exempt, Procedure Rule). Take notice that these amendments are not subject to codification and will not appear in Title 4 of the New Jersey Administrative Code.

Notice of Correction of Printing Errors in the Code Concerning Maintenance of Hotels and Multiple Dwellings

Take notice that there are several printing errors in Chapter 10 in Title 5 of the New Jersey Administrative Code. These errors, which will be corrected in the next updating of Title 5 of the Code, are summarized as follows:

1. The title of Chapter 10 on p. xi and p. 10-1 should read "Maintenance of Hotels and Multiple Dwellings."

2. The duplicate definition of "grade" (i.e., "grade" means the finished service of the ground, either paved or unpaved) appearing in N.J.A.C. 5:10-2.2 on p. 10-16 in Title 5 should be deleted. The current, correct definition of "grade" should be "'grade' means a reference plane representing the average of finished ground level adjoining the building at all exterior walls."

3. Several references to definitions that formerly appeared in N.J.A.C. 5:10-2.2 but were deleted therein by R.1979 d.259 (See: 11 N.J.R. 164(a), 11 N.J.R. 366(b)) will be deleted from the Index in Title 5.

Notice of Hearings Concerning Construction of Mausoleums

Take notice that Philip B. Caton, Director of the Division of Housing in the Department of Community Affairs, has issued the following Notice of Hearing concerning the construction of mausoleums.

Please take notice that a public hearing will be held on March 20, 1980 at 10:00 a.m. in the Grand Assembly Chamber, State House, West State Street, Trenton, New Jersey for the purpose of receiving comments as to the necessity of adopting standards, more restrictive than those set forth in subcodes of the Uniform Construction Code which have already been adopted, to govern the construction of mausoleums.

This public hearing shall be held pursuant to Chapter 255 of the laws of 1979, approved December 21, 1979. The Department does not plan to enact any regulations supplementing the already adopted subcodes of the Uniform Construction Code unless need for such regulations is clearly and convincingly demonstrated at the public hearing.

The Department does not propose to enact any regulations dealing with site engineering, planning, zoning or other matters subject to municipal regulation or with outdoor air quality, which is subject to regulation by the Department of Environmental Protection.

All persons wishing to present testimony at the public hearing are advised to be prepared to present and justify specific recommendations as to standards to be adopted and to present evidence as to durability and cost of materials.

**Proposed Amendments on
Purchase and Loan of Textbooks**

The State Board of Education, pursuant to authority of N.J.S.A. 18A:58-37.1 et seq., proposes to amend N.J.A.C. 6:20-6.2 (responsibility of the board) and 6:20-6.8 (State aid) in the rules pertaining to the Purchase and Loan of Textbooks.

The proposed amendments are designed to bring the Code in conformity with revised State statutes, and change the State allowance that local districts can spend to purchase textbooks for non-public schools.

Full text of the proposal follows (additions indicated in boldface thus; deletions indicated in brackets [thus]).

6:20-6.2 Responsibility of the board

(a) Local boards of education, in accordance with section 1 of this subchapter, are required to purchase textbooks in the amount resulting from the total number of resident pupils in grades kindergarten through 12 as of the last school day of September of the preceding school year multiplied by **[\$15.00] the State average budgeted textbook expense per public school pupil for the pre-budget year.**

(b) Existing book stocks and newly purchased textbooks purchased pursuant to this statute must be distributed among all pupils on an equitable basis.

(c) A local board of education shall not discriminate against pupils in either public or nonpublic schools.

6:20-6.8 State aid

(a) State aid shall be an amount equal to, but not to exceed, the authorized ceiling. The ceiling amount is **[\$15.00**

per pupil for the school years 1974-75, 1975-76, and 1976-77 and \$10.00 per pupil in subsequent years] the State average budgeted textbook expense per public school pupil for the pre-budget year.

(b) The calculation of aid will be as follows:

1. The number of resident pupils on the last school day of September of the previous year, enrolled as full-time pupils in grades kindergarten through 12 in a nonpublic school multiplied by the ceiling.

2. State aid shall be apportioned to the school district where the pupil resides.

3. The Commissioner shall, upon request of the local board of education, distribute State aid on a quarterly basis October 1, December 1, February 1 and May 1.

4. State aid provided pursuant to the [State School Incentive Equalization Aid law (N.J.S.A. 18A:58.1 et seq) in the school years 1974-75, 1975-76, and 1976-77] **Public School Education Act of 1975 (N.J.S.A. 18:7A-1 et seq.) may be expended for the purchase and loan of textbooks for public school pupils [on an average of \$15.00 per pupil in resident enrollment.] in an amount which shall not exceed the State average budgeted textbook expense for the pre-budget year per pupil in resident enrollment.**

(c) Nothing contained herein shall prohibit a board of education in any district from purchasing textbooks in excess of the amount provided pursuant to this act.

Proposes Rules on Family Life Education

The State Board of Education, pursuant to authority of N.J.S.A. 18A:4-15, 18A:33-1, 18A:35-5, 18A:35-6, and 18A:35-7, proposes to adopt new rules on **Family Life Education Programs**, to be cited as N.J.A.C. 6:29-7.1.

These rules would require local boards of education to develop courses in family life education for all pupils. Parents will have the option of requesting (by means of a signed statement to the school principal) that their children be excused from that portion of the course where instruction given is in conflict with their conscience or sincerely held moral or religious beliefs.

Full text of the proposed rules follows.

SUBCHAPTER 7. FAMILY LIFE EDUCATION PROGRAMS

6:29-7.1 Family life education

(a) As used in this subchapter, "family life education program" means instruction to develop an understanding

of the physical, mental, emotional, social, economic, and psychological effects of interpersonal relationships between persons of various ages. The program of studies shall include the physiological and the psychological basis of human development, sexuality, and reproduction. In addition, the program shall provide opportunity for pupils to develop attitudes and practices which will strengthen family life in the present, aid in establishing strong families of their own and contribute to the improvement of the community.

(b) The local school district program shall be developed through appropriate consultation and participation of teachers, school administrators, parents and community members. This process shall be continued as the program is reviewed and updated in future years.

1. The parents of pupils enrolled in the district shall have the opportunity to review annually the program and all instructional materials prior to classroom use.

(c) The district's family life education program shall be implemented through a coordinated comprehensive sequential kindergarten through 12 curriculum with instructional units appropriate to the age, growth and development, and maturity of their pupils.

1. Upon completion of grades K-8, the family life education program should include, but not be limited to, the following areas of concentration: the importance of the family unit, each family member's responsibility to other family members, duties and role of various family members, communication within the family, purpose and function of the family in our culture, parenting, plant and animal growth, plant and animal reproduction, human growth and development, differences in growth between boys and girls, reproductive system of males and females, human reproduction, heredity, social and emotional growth, responsibilities of adolescence, dating, interpersonal relationships, the dangers of talking to strangers, child abuse and neglect, sexual assault and incest.

2. Upon the completion of grades 9-12, the family life education program should include, but not be limited to, the following areas of concentration: parenting and child rearing, psycho-social development, sexuality and personality development, physical changes occurring during adolescence, preparation for marriage, family planning and the birth of a baby. In addition, the following areas should be reviewed: interpersonal relations, dating, human reproduction, heredity, child abuse, sexual assault and incest.

(d) Teaching staff members holding one of the following certificates are eligible to teach in the district's family life education program:

1. Biology;
2. Comprehensive science;
3. Elementary;
4. Health education;
5. Health and physical education;
6. Home economics;
7. Nursery;
8. School nurse;
9. Teacher of psychology.

(e) Districts that develop their program with an interdisciplinary approach may use teachers from other disciplines to assist one or several of the teachers from the list in subsection (d).

(f) Districts may use resource people to assist with their program; that is, doctor, clergyman, lawyer, parent, and the like.

(g) The local school district shall provide the opportunity for inservice education to those teachers responsible for family life education programs.

(h) The State Department of Education shall develop guidelines in family life education for use by the local school districts.

(i) The local board of education shall establish procedures so that any pupil, whose parent or guardian presents to the school principal a signed statement that any part of the instructions in family life education is in conflict with his/her conscience, or sincerely held moral or religious beliefs, shall be excused from that portion of the course where such instruction is being given and no penalties as to credit or graduation shall result therefrom.

(j) The family life education program shall be implemented in all local school districts beginning September 1, 1981.

(k) This subchapter is subject to all of the provisions of N.J.A.C. 6:8-4.2.

Amendments Concerning Operation Of Summer Schools

On February 6, 1980, Fred G. Burke, Commissioner of Education and Secretary of the State Board of Education, pursuant to authority of N.J.S.A. 18A:4-10, 18A:38-4, 18A:54B-1 and -2, as well as the Commissioner's decision in the matter of the appeals of the Boards of Education of the Black Horse Pike Regional School District and the Sterling Regional School District, Camden County, 1973 S.L.D. 130, affirmed State Board of Education, 1973 S.L.D. 138 and in accordance with applicable provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act, adopted emergency amendments to N.J.A.C. 6:26-3.1 and 6:27-3.1 concerning the operation of summer schools.

Full text of the adoption follows (additions indicated in boldface thus; deletions indicated in brackets [thus]).

6:26-3.1(d) Reasonable tuition may be charged for enrichment courses which are determined by the county superintendent of schools to be unrelated to the curriculum of the regular school program.

[[d]] (e) Application for renewal of approval shall be reviewed and approved annually by the county superintendent of schools.

6:27-3.1(c) Reasonable tuition may be charged for enrichment courses which carry no credit and are determined by the county superintendent of schools to be unrelated to the curriculum of the regular school program.

[(c)] (d) Application for renewal of approval shall be reviewed and approved annually by the county superintendent of schools.

The purpose of the Industrial Survey Project is to obtain data from industrial establishments concerning the use, manufacture, packaging, repackaging, disposal, and release into the environment of selected carcinogenic and toxic chemicals, in order for the Department to make preliminary assessment as to the role these substances play in the development of cancer and other diseases in New Jersey.

When originally proposed in March 1979, the list of selected substances to be investigated by the Industrial Survey Project included 182 elements and compounds. Subsequently, in the May 1979 Register, an additional 119 compounds were proposed for inclusion on the list, for a total of 301 substances. 152 of these were dropped in the adoption of the regulations governing the Survey, mostly because they are not commercially produced or used in substantial quantities in New Jersey.

The six substances proposed to be added to the present survey list of 149 are:

1. benzamide
2. decabromodiphenyl oxide (DBDO)
3. methoxychlor
4. phosgene
5. polychlorinated triphenyls (PCT's)
6. 2, 4, 5 - trichlorophenol

These compounds have been selected for addition based on their toxicity and carcinogenic properties, and because of the substantial quantities produced or used in the state.

N.J.S.A. 13:1D-9(a) authorizes the Department to conduct and supervise research programs for the purpose of determining the causes and effects of hazards to the environment. N.J.S.A. 13:1D-9(c) authorizes the Department, in accordance with regulations established by it, to require the filing of reports by persons engaged in operations which may result in pollution of the environment. N.J.S.A. 58:14A-4 authorizes the Commissioner to adopt and enforce regulations to prevent, control, or abate water pollution and to carry out the intent of the New Jersey Water Pollution Control Act. Information obtained through the Industrial Survey will be used as a basis for the development of new regulatory proposals. Thus the Survey constitutes an important part of the Department's efforts to carry out the aims of the Water Pollution Control Act and the other statutes it administers.

The Department invites public comment on these proposed amendments to the selected substances list of the Industrial Survey Regulations. Comments should be sent by Friday, March 28, 1980.

In the event of an archeological district nomination the open public meeting requirement may be waived.

(1) A letter will be sent to all property owners within the proposed historic area, 30 days prior to the hearing, indicating what registration of the historic area will mean to the owner; the benefits and responsibilities of historic area registration; the date, time and place the open hearing will be held; and the place the nomination document can be examined prior to the hearing. Alternative methods of notification, such as publication in the official newspaper of the municipality or in a newspaper circulating in the municipality, may be used when the number of property owners in a historic area exceeds three hundred (300).

* * * * *

vi. As per Heritage Conservation and Recreation Service, U.S. Department of the Interior requirements, all National Register forms (New Jersey Register of Historic Places applications) shall be reviewed and analyzed by a professional body, the State Review Committee for Historic Sites, as defined in the Federal Register, Vol. 42, No. 183, Wednesday, September 21, 1977, p. 47659, using the criteria in section 4.2.

(1) On the State Review Committee's recommendation, an application shall be transmitted to the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Protection for final action.

(2) In the case of a historic area nomination in which the State Review Committee enlarges the boundaries, new property owner(s) will be notified and be given 30 days to comment prior to final State action.

Proposed New and Amended Rules Concerning Water Quality Standards

Jerry Fitzgerald English, Commissioner of Environmental Protection, pursuant to the authority of N.J.S.A. 13:1D-1 et seq., N.J.S.A. 58:10A-1 et seq., and N.J.S.A. 58:11A-1 et seq., proposes to adopt new and amended rules to be cited as N.J.A.C. 7:9-4, 7:9-5, and 7:9-6 concerning Surface Water Quality Standards, Treatment Requirements of Wastewaters Discharged Into Surface Waters of the State and Ground-Water Quality Standards. Pursuant to the same authority, the Commissioner proposes to repeal the existing subchapters 4, 8 and 14 of chapter 9 of Title 7 of the New Jersey Administrative Code. This proposal is known within the Department of Environmental Protection as Docket No. DEP 010-80-02.

The provisions of section 303 of the Federal Clean Water Act, as amended, 33 U.S.C.A. 1251 et seq. mandate that the State water pollution control agency adopt and, from time to time, review and, as appropriate, modify surface water quality standards. The Surface Water Quality Standards being proposed at this time contain a number of modifications to those standards adopted on November 18, 1974. The proposed rules are consistent with the pur-

pose and intent of the Water Quality Planning Act, Federal Clean Water Act, and the Federal Regulations governing water quality standards (40 CFR 35.1550).

The proposed rules concerning Surface Water Quality Standards contain sections regarding definitions, policy statements, designated uses and water quality criteria, and surface water classifications. The major revisions and additions to the standards consist of technical revisions to various classifications, standards for certain toxic substances, heat dissipation areas, special water quality standards for tidal portions of Morses Creek, and clarification of the State's Antidegradation Policy.

The proposed rules concerning Treatment Requirements of Wastewaters Discharged Into Surface Waters of the State contain sections regarding definitions, policy statements, wasteload allocation objectives and procedures, minimum treatment requirements, procedures for modifying water quality based effluent limitations, and procedures for reclassifying specific segments for less restrictive uses. The major revisions and additions to the treatment requirements consist of a seasonal disinfection policy and designation of areas eligible for seasonal disinfection, procedures for establishing water quality based effluent limitations for individual dischargers, technical revisions to certain minimum treatment requirements, procedures for modifying water quality based effluent limitations, and procedures for reclassifying specific segments for less restrictive uses.

The designated uses and special surface water quality criteria for the Central Pine Barrens adopted on January 23, 1978 are not subject to review at this time. Only minor and, in the opinion of the Department of Environmental Protection, inconsequential changes in language have been made to those standards. The Central Pine Barrens Standards are included in the proposed Surface Water Quality rules for the purpose of continuity and clarity.

The proposed rules concerning Ground-Water Quality Standards contain sections regarding definitions, statements of policy, ground water designated uses and quality criteria, ground water designated areas, effluent standards and discharger requirements, and procedures for modifying ground-water quality based effluent limitations. The sections of the proposed rules which apply Statewide are new. Only minor and, in the opinion of the Department of Environmental Protection, inconsequential revisions have been made to the Ground Water Quality Standards for the Central Pine Barrens adopted on January 23, 1978. The Central Pine Barrens Standards are included in the proposed Ground Water Quality rules for the purpose of continuity and clarity.

The Department of Environmental Protection has prepared Basis and Background documents explaining the proposed revisions to Surface Water Quality Standards, Treatment Requirements of Wastewaters Discharged Into Surface Waters of the State, and Ground-Water Quality Standards. Deer found dead on or along any public highway may be disposed of by municipal officers or personnel authorized by them only at a sanitary landfill registered with the Solid Waste Administration, of the Department of Environmental Protection.

7:25-17.2 Dead deer on private property

Deer found dead on any private property, shall be disposed of by municipal officers or personnel authorized by them, upon request of the property owner in the manner prescribed above.

7:25-17.3 Possession of dead deer

Municipal police officers may not authorize the possession of dead deer by anyone for any purpose other than the disposal of the deer at a registered sanitary landfill in the manner prescribed above.

7:25-17.4 Information required

(a) Any municipal police officer disposing of, or authorizing the disposal of dead deer shall inform the Division of Fish, Game and Wildlife of:

1. The location where the deer was recovered;
2. The sex of the deer;
3. The site where the deer was disposed of; and
4. The date of disposal.

Proposed New Rules Concerning the Statewide Management of Septage Disposal

Jerry Fitzgerald English, Commissioner of Environmental Protection, pursuant to the authority of the New Jersey Water Pollution Control Act (N.J.S.A. 58:10A-1 et seq.), the New Jersey Water Quality Planning Act (N.J.S.A. 58:11A-1 et seq.), the Solid Waste Management Act (N.J.S.A. 13:1E-1 et seq.), N.J.S.A. 13:1B-5, N.J.S.A. 13:1D-1 et seq., proposes to adopt rules concerning the statewide management of septage.

These rules are proposed in response to the Solid Waste Management Act, (N.J.S.A. 13:1E-42, P.L. 1976, c.99) which, after March 15, 1980, prohibits the disposal to a landfill, of bulk liquids, including domestic septage, unless such landfill is lined and has a leachate collection system which is acceptable to the Department.

These rules require that sewerage agencies dispose of septage generated within their service areas or temporary septage service areas as designated by the Department by the Statewide Septage Management Plan (Appendix A). This plan was established by the Department based upon

estimated septage generation rates and the available capacity of a sewerage agency to dispose of septage at the existing treatment works. Sewerage agencies have been classified into four categories. The scope of the responsibility of a sewerage agency concerning disposal of septage is dependent upon the designated category.

The proposed rules include the following sections:

- General provisions;
- Planning for the disposal of septage;
- National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit or Pollution Control Permit (PCP);
- Sewerage Agency responsibility for disposing of septage;
- Hauler responsibility for disposing of septage;
- Septage generator responsibility for disposal of septage;
- General responsibility for disposing of septage;
- Fees;
- Violations.

On January 28, 1980, Jerry Fitzgerald English, Commissioner of Environmental Protection, pursuant to authority of N.J.S.A. 13:1D-1 et seq., 24:2-1, 24:14-2 and in accordance with applicable provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act, adopted emergency amendments which repealed the current text of N.J.A.C. 7:12-1.4 regarding the condemnation of certain waters in the Atlantic Ocean concerning shellfish harvesting.

The Commissioner of Environmental Protection, following detailed investigations by the Shellfish Control Unit, finds that the peril to the public health, safety and welfare no longer exists.

7:12-1.4 [Temporary closures] (Reserved)

[(a) The State Department of Environmental Protection, to protect the public health, hereby condemns for harvesting of shellfish until further notice, the following waters, by amendment to N.J.A.C. 7:12-1.3.

1. All those waters of the Atlantic Ocean within New Jersey's jurisdictional 3 mile limit southwest from a line extending from the standpipe at Surf City and bearing 122°T to a line bearing 306° through Fl G 4 sec. GONG at Absecon Inlet.

2. In addition, all those estuarine, inlet, channel and other waters enclosed by a line from the southwest side of Absecon Inlet and bearing approximately 321°T to the Intracoastal Waterway (as shown on nautical chart 12316) then following and including the Intracoastal Waterway in a northerly direction to Fl 8 ft. "25" at the mouth of Main Marsh thoro fare, then bearing approximately 043°T to FIR "2" (at Long Point), then bearing approximately 129°T to the tower at Spray Beach, then following the coast line in a southerly direction, across Beach Haven Inlet and Little Egg Inlet and along the coast line of Brigantine to its point of origin in Absecon Inlet.

3. The above described closures include all connecting waterways between the Atlantic Ocean and the bays described.]

A boarding home shall not accept or retain, for the purpose of providing services to, any person who, because of his/her physical or mental condition, is judged by a physician to require care and services above the level of

dietary services, supervision of self-administration of medications, assistance in activities of daily living, and/or assistance in obtaining health and social services, or who is incontinent or non-ambulatory.

1. The following definitions shall apply to this Standard, N.J.A.C. 8:43-4.1(a)3:

(1) "Incontinent" shall mean a person who is lacking sphincter control of the bowels, bladder, or both or who has an ostomy.

(2) "Non-ambulatory" shall mean a person who is bed-fast, chairfast, can sit in, but not propel, a wheelchair, or is incapable of walking without human assistance.

(a) If a refund is due to a student under the institution's refund policy and the student received financial aid under any State student assistance program, the institution will multiply the institutional refund by the following fraction to determine the amount to be refunded to the Treasurer, State of New Jersey, through the Office of Student Assistance:

amount of State assistance (minus work earnings) awarded for the payment period

total amount of financial aid (minus work earnings) awarded for the payment period

(b) The above formula will also be applied if a student reduces his academic course load to less than full-time prior to the date full tuition liability is required by the institution.

(c) If a combination of State student funds has been packaged for the student, the prorated amount is applied to each of the State programs in the student's financial aid package. If the combination of State awards for the payment period is less or equal to the tuition charged, the student cannot receive a cash refund of State assistance greater than the tuition charged for the enrollment period.

(d) If a student utilizes any portion of an award, it will be treated the same as a full semester payment in calculating the number of semesters of eligibility. Thus, the institution will afford the student the opportunity to decline and repay the State award for that payment period.

They shall be selected by the Chancellor from among nominations by such agencies and organizations as the Department of Health, the Department of Human Services, medical and dental schools in the State, the State Health Coordinating Council, the Medical Society of New Jersey, the New Jersey Association of Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons, the New Jersey Dental Society, medical and dental student societies, and consumers, so as to achieve a balance of interested and knowledgeable representation. The Chancellor or his representative shall be an ex-officio non-voting member of the advisory committee. Members shall serve for a three-year term or until a successor is appointed with the exception of representatives of student organizations and consumers, who shall serve one year terms. Any vacancies in the voting membership other than by expiration of term shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment but for the unexpired term only.

Proposed Amendments Concerning Medicaid Reimbursement for Abortions

Ann Klein, Commissioner of Human Services, pursuant to authority of N.J.S.A. 30:4D-1 et seq. and in accordance with an order of the Superior Court of New Jersey, Chancery Division, proposes to amend certain sections in four separate Manuals (i.e., Hospital, Special Hospital, Physicians and Independent Clinic Manuals) concerning Medicaid reimbursement for abortions.

The proposal concerns the deletion of the current text of N.J.A.C. 10:52-1.16, 10:53-1.14, 10:54-1.23 and 10:66-1.18 and the adoption of new text therein.

Full text of the proposed new rules follows.

- 10:52-1.16 Medicaid reimbursement for abortions
- 10:53-1.14 Medicaid reimbursement for abortions
- 10:54-1.23 Medicaid reimbursement for abortions
- 10:66-1.18 Medicaid reimbursement for abortions

(a) Effective April 1, 1980, the Division of Medical Assistance will reimburse providers for the costs of all medically necessary abortions in any of the following instances:

1. The life of the mother would be endangered if the fetus were carried to term;
 2. The patient was a victim of rape or incest and has reported the rape or incest within 60 days of the incident to a law enforcement agency or public health service;
 3. All other medically necessary abortions.
- (b) No reimbursement will be made for abortions based solely on consideration of family planning, or emotional or social convenience, or to prevent insignificant impairments to health.

(c) The determinations of medical necessity are subject to review by Medicaid in accordance with existing

rules and regulations of the Medicaid Program. Effective April 1, 1980, reimbursement will be made to Medicaid participating providers for medically necessary abortions performed with the following guidelines:

1. Medically necessary abortions may be performed up to and during the 12th week of pregnancy in a licensed hospital, licensed physician's office or licensed independent abortion clinic.

2. Medically necessary abortions performed after the 12th week of pregnancy must be performed in a licensed hospital.

i. Exception: Termination of pregnancy using the dilation and evacuation procedure, within a period of gestation not exceeding 16 menstrual weeks and/or 14 gestational weeks size as determined by a physician, may be performed in a licensed independent abortion clinic approved for participation in the Medicaid Program.

3. A physician certification (form FD-179, rev. 2/80) must be attached to the physician's Medicaid claim form.

i. A copy of the completed FD-179 must also be attached to:

() The hospital's or independent clinic's Medicaid claim form as appropriate;

() The anesthesiologist's Medicaid claim form.

10:52-1.16(d) and 10:53-1.14(d) New Jersey hospitals with tape-to-tape or teleprocessing billing capabilities will be required to submit hard-copy inpatient MC-1 or outpatient MC-4 claim forms for all abortion claims.

10:81-3.17(c) "Continued absence from the home" (see section 2.7(d) of this chapter) may be for any reason. The following are some of the ways to [verify] establish absence:

[A parent shall be considered continuously absent when

there is documentary proof of divorce, pending divorce, or separation agreement. Such documentary proof includes but is not limited to official legal documents, court or attorney records or newspaper accounts at time divorce is granted. Such documentation shall be noted in the income maintenance file.] Divorce - Documentary proof of divorce, pending divorce, or separation agreement (i.e., official legal documents, court or attorney records or newspaper accounts) may be indicative of "continued absence from the home" but must be verified and documented in the case file.

10:81-3.17(f)1. If there is a support order already in effect against the absent parent, this may be deemed evidence of continuing absence to establish eligibility for AFDC. Such findings shall be noted in the income maintenance file.

Proposed Amendments Concerning Application on Behalf of a Critically Ill or Hospitalized Client by an Authorized Agent

Ann Klein, Commissioner of Human Services, pursuant to authority of N.J.S.A. 44:8-111, proposes to amend a portion of the General Assistance Manual concerning application on behalf of a critically ill or hospitalized client by an authorized agent.

Full text of the proposal follows (additions indicated in boldface thus; deletions indicated in brackets [thus]).

10:85-3.2(a)1.iii. Application: A written request for [g]General [a]Assistance by an individual who wishes to apply for him/herself and his/her dependent, if any[,] or a request from an authorized agent acting on behalf of such an individual (see subsection (c)2. of this section).

10:85-3.2(c)1. Application/affidavit: Any person who indicates a wish to apply for [g]General [a]Assistance shall be recognized as an applicant. Such individual will be assisted by an MWD worker in completing the application (Form GA-1). He/she shall then be required to sign under oath the attached affidavit attesting to the correctness of his/her statements.

i. Form GA-1, Application and affidavit for general assistance, shall be used in every case for the initial application. The Director of Welfare or MWD caseworker is empowered to receive the oath and witness the applicant's signature[,] or the signature of an authorized agent acting in situations described in paragraph 2 of this subsection.

ii. When application is being made for more than one person, it must be signed by all persons for whom assistance is requested except dependent children under age 18.

2. Authorized agent:

i. A legally appointed guardian shall always be recognized as an authorized agent to initiate an application to establish eligibility for general assistance.

ii. In general assistance, an individual who wishes to apply may be confined at home or at an institution, or may be subject to a critical illness or injury which impedes action on his/her own behalf. Consequently, the MWD shall accept any one of the following, in the order of priority as listed, as an authorized agent for the purpose of initiating an application:

- (1) A relative by blood or marriage;
- (2) A staff member of a public or private welfare agency of which the person is a client, who has been designated by the agency to so act;
- (3) A physician or attorney of whom the person is respectively a patient or client;
- (4) A staff member of an institution or facility in which a person is receiving care, who has been designated by the institutional facility to so act.

[2]3. Binding upon eligible unit: [Such] The application and affidavit is binding upon the individual(s) signing this

document and upon any other member(s) of the eligible unit for whom he/she is applying. An authorized agent is obliged to complete the application to the best of his/her knowledge.

[3]4. Personal interview: The application shall be taken at a personal interview with the client unless an authorized agent is acting on behalf of a client in accordance with paragraph 2 of this subsection. [Such] The interview may occur at the welfare office or in the client's home (or hospital or other institution, if necessary).

[4]5. Social security number

[5]6. Registration and case number

Proposed Amendments Concerning Workfare

Ann Klein, Commissioner of Human Services, pursuant to authority of N.J.S.A. 44:8-111, proposes to amend portions of the General Assistance Manual concerning the assignment of clients to worksites by the municipal welfare department and the New Jersey Employment Service and provisions governing such assignments.

Full text of the proposal follows (additions indicated in boldface thus; deletions indicated in brackets [thus]).

10:85-3.2(g)4. Project activity: Employable recipients for whom the Employment Service is unable to locate immediate employment [may] shall be assigned to work [activity developed by the Employment Service] projects in accordance with the provisions of subchapter 10 of this chapter. Persons who fail or refuse to perform in such assignments shall be subject to penalty as prescribed in that chapter. The MWD will provide all necessary cooperation with the Employment Service.

i. Development of projects and designation of participants are functions assigned by law to the Employment Service. The MWD may recommend proposed projects to the Employment Service but will not undertake development of nor assign recipients to projects.

ii. The Employment Service will select the participants by review of Work Registration Forms (NJES-511B). The MWD will supply to the Employment Service on request the amount and period of grant of each selected recipient.

Payments for medical care will not be included in the report to the Employment Service.

iii. The MWD will receive written notice (Form NJES - 1A) from the Employment Service office of the assignment of any recipient to project activity, satisfactory or unsatis-

factory performance, any offer of regular employment, or completion of the assignment.

(1) Upon notice of assignment to a work project, the MWD will immediately advise the recipient via written notice of adverse action that assistance will be terminated upon failure without good cause to perform in the assigned activity in a satisfactory manner.

(2) Upon receipt of notice from the Employment Service of unsatisfactory performance without good cause, the MWD will discontinue assistance in accordance with section 327.6(c)2).

(A) In the absence of a report of unsatisfactory performance, the MWD will assume that performance is satisfactory.]

5. Good cause: [The New Jersey Employment Service will determine whether or not good cause existed for failure or refusal to participate in project activity.] In all [other] situations in which the MWD makes a determination, the failure or refusal to accept or retain employment for good cause is established when any of the following exist:

i. No bona fide offer of employment was received by the individual.

ii. Rates offered or paid were less than an applicable minimum wage established by law.

iii. The individual was physically unable to engage in the employment in question.

iv. No reasonable means of transportation to work was available.

v. Working conditions were hazardous to health or safety. vi. An offered job was available solely because of a strike or walkout of other employees of the employer or organization offering employment.

vii. The job required membership in a union which the recipient did not wish to join.

10:85-3.2(g)6.iii. [(2) Any person who fails or refuses without good cause, as determined by the NJES, to perform satisfactorily in assigned project activity (Section 327.4) shall be ineligible for cash assistance. If the notice of adverse action required in Section 327.4(c)1) was sent at least 10 days prior to the MWD's receipt of information from NJES, assistance shall be discontinued immediately. If not, assistance shall be discontinued at the termination of the 10 day notice period. . . . Payments for medical care will not be discontinued under this section.

(A) A person who satisfactorily performs only part of assigned project activity shall be subject to deletion of that amount of his/her grant which represents the part of the work not satisfactorily performed.

(B) A penalty of ineligibility invoked for this reason shall be lifted upon a demonstration of willingness to work or willingness to resume project work. The demonstration may be accomplished by actual performance in employment or in project activity if either is still available. If neither is available, the person's signed and credible statement of intention to resume will suffice until one or the other becomes available.]

SUBCHAPTER 10. WORKFARE

10:85-10.1 Work assignments

(a) All employable recipients of general assistance shall participate in work assignments in accordance with the provisions of this chapter. See section 3.2(g) of this chapter regarding registration.

(b) Through the Employment Service/General Assistance Employability Program (ES/GAEP), the New Jersey Employment Service develops and supervises work activities and worksites to which employable general assistance

recipients are assigned by that agency. In addition, municipal welfare directors will establish worksites to which they will assign recipients, subject to final approval of ES/GAEP staff within 14 days of the initial assignment. Until such approval is received, such assignments shall be considered "interim worksite assignments."

10:85-10.2 Municipal worksite agreements

(a) To insure State Workers' Compensation coverage for all worksite participants in interim assignments developed by MWDs, a Municipal Worksite Agreement (MWSA) must be signed by both the MWD and the worksite agent who is a paid employee of the agency for whom the worksite activity is being performed with authority from that agency for conducting onsite supervision of participants and maintaining time and attendance reports.

(b) The MWD will supply to the appropriate ES/GAEP office a MWSA for each worksite established. Employment Service staff will notify the MWD of receipt of the MWSA by use of Form NJES-1A. No recipient of GA shall report to a worksite until the ES/GAEP staff has received the signed MWSA.

(c) Attendance and worksite activity for interim worksite assignments developed by municipal welfare directors will be monitored during the interim period of not more than 14 days by the welfare director or other appropriate municipal staff so designated by the Director of Welfare.

(d) A notice (2 copies) will be prepared for each worksite participant (see Appendix). The notice will inform the participant of his/her worksite schedule, the wage rate used to determine this schedule (days of the week, hours of work), whom to report to on the worksite, and the address of the worksite. One copy will be retained by the participant; the other will be kept in the participant's case folder.

1. The participant shall also, at the time of initial assignment, be provided with a notice of termination of assistance effective immediately upon failure or refusal without good cause to perform satisfactorily in the work project. The notice shall advise of the right to a fair hearing but shall not offer continued assistance pending the hearing decision.

(e) Interim worksite assignments developed by the municipal welfare director will be monitored and evaluated by the ES/GAEP staff within 14 days after the ES has received the MWSA. Evaluation will be based on the following criteria:

1. The individual assigned is capable of performing the duties involved at the worksite.

2. Working conditions are such that they do not represent a substantial risk to the individual's health and safety.

3. The participant has a reasonable means of transportation to the worksite assignment. "Reasonable" shall in this case mean at no extra cost to the participant.

(f) If any of the criteria in subsection (e) of this section is not met, ES staff will inform the welfare director through use of Form NJES-1A that the participant is being reassigned immediately. The MWD will promptly notify the participant, advising that the current assignment is no longer in effect and that the assignment by the ES is effective immediately but that the performance requirement is still in effect. The MWD will confirm the assignment change and reminder of the performance requirement to the participant in writing.

1. Failure by the MWD to comply with the NJES reassignment notice will lead to the municipality's assumption of responsibility for liability coverage on that worksite.

10:85-10.3 Location of worksite activity

(a) Worksite assignments may be established by the municipal welfare director in the performance of work for the municipality or a non-profit agency or institution pursuant to a contract with the municipality.

(b) Worksite assignments may be established by the Employment Service in the performance of work for county or State agencies as well as municipal agencies, non-profit agencies and institutions.

(c) Efforts by either the Employment Service or municipal welfare director will be made to develop worksites in the municipality where the employable GA recipient receives his/her public assistance grant.

(d) If worksites are not available in the municipality where an employable GA recipient receives his/her public assistance grant, the municipal welfare director shall immediately notify the appropriate ES staff, and worksite development will become the responsibility of the Employment Service.

10:85-10.4 Scheduling worksite assignments

(a) Persons assigned to a worksite by either ES/GAEP or the MWD shall work only the number of hours equal to their grant divided by an hourly rate commensurate with beginning regular employees similarly employed. For this purpose, the MWD will supply to the ES/GAEP staff, on request, the amount and period of grant for persons working on GAEP supervised worksites.

(b) In such cases where there are no beginning regular employees similarly employed, the ES/GAEP or MWD will contact the local labor market analyst and determine the prevailing wage rate for that particular worksite assignment. This hourly wage rate shall be recorded as a part of the Municipal Worksite Agreement.

10:85-10.5 Types of work allowable under worksite activities

(a) The type of work to be performed by an employable GA recipient will be based upon an assessment of the individual's employment capabilities and the service needs of the municipality. Whenever possible, worksites will permit an individual to utilize and/or enhance his/her employment capabilities in order to maximize that individual's chances of obtaining unsubsidized employment.

(b) Worksite assignments will not result in either the replacement or displacement of regular employees.

10:85-10.6 Failure to perform

(a) Any recipient who fails or refuses without good cause to perform satisfactorily in any worksite assignment made in accordance with the provisions of this chapter shall be ineligible for assistance. The MWD shall, without further notice, discontinue assistance, except for medical payments, immediately upon a determination of the absence of good cause or 10 days after the date of the notice of termination (N.J.A.C. 10:85-10.2(d)1) whichever occurs later.

1. In the event that a person subject to penalty in this subsection is a member of a household of more than one, the termination of assistance shall apply only to that person's per capita share of the grant. There shall be no notice of reduction to the other member(s).

10:85-10.7 Good cause

(a) On worksites under the supervision of the ES/GAEP, the ES may or may not supply a determination as to whether good cause existed for a failure or refusal to perform. If the ES advises the MWD in writing that good cause did not exist, the MWD will accept the determination without further review. If the ES reports a failure or refusal without a determination of good cause, the MWD shall make the determination in accordance with N.J.A.C. 10:85-3.2(g)5.

(b) On worksites under the supervision of the MWD, the MWD shall determine good cause in accordance with N.J.A.C. 10:85-3.2(g)5.

10:85-10.8 Reinstatement

Any person who has incurred a penalty of ineligibility under section 6 of this subchapter may request reinstatement. Such a person shall be reinstated and grant payments resumed after the person has actually started or resumed project work in a satisfactory manner. If project work no longer exists, a signed and credible statement of intent to resume will suffice until such work becomes available.

10:85-3.3(f)4.ii. Other boarding homes: When an individual other than a spouse or dependent child under 18 of the operator is purchasing [a room and/or living arrangement] room and board in a group facility or a boarding home other than a Licensed Boarding Home for Sheltered Care as in (a) above, or a center for treatment of drug or alcohol abuse as in subparagraph iv. of this paragraph, the total monthly allowance [, including personal incidental allowance,] shall be the amount for a single individual as given in Schedule I or Schedule II, as appropriate, less any countable income.

10:85-3.5(b) In order to continue granting assistance, the MWD shall make a complete redetermination for each case at least once every six months[.] except that for the chronically ill, recertification by a physician via Form GA-18 shall be made at time intervals in accordance with N.J.A.C. 10:85-5.3(f)1.i.

10:85-5.2(a) The Director of Welfare may authorize payment for inpatient care and services in an approved hospital if such has been prescribed by a fully licensed

physician, dentist or podiatrist for medical, surgical or psychiatric treatment, diagnosis, and/or rehabilitation. [Such payment(s) must be authorized for eligible persons living in municipalities located in First Class Counties (currently, Essex and Hudson) and entering hospitals in such counties.] When an eligible person is hospitalized in a county of the first class, the Director of Welfare of the municipality of residence, wherever in New Jersey that municipality may be located, must authorize the payment. Currently the counties of the first class are Hudson, Essex, and Bergen.

10:85-5.3(f)1.i. Physician recertification by means of a new Form GA-18 shall be required according to the date shown in section A.8. of the previous certification or one year from the date of the physician's signature, whichever is earlier.

i. Payment may be authorized for security deposits for rent and/or utilities when the municipal welfare director determines it is necessary to establish the client in a new permanent living arrangement.

ii. For victims of domestic violence the regular grant of assistance (including calculated earned income and exempt income) is not to be counted in the determination of eligibility for or the amount of emergency assistance payments authorized for "temporary" emergency arrangements in shelters.

(1) When plans for more permanent living arrangements

are made, any funds actually available to the client are to be counted in the determination of emergency assistance payments for shelter, utility deposits, furniture and appliances.

Ann Klein, Commissioner of Human Services, pursuant to authority of N.J.S.A. 30:4B-2, proposes to amend a portion of the Food Stamp Manual concerning the rounding of medical and shelter deductions for the elderly and disabled.

Full text of the proposal follows (additions indicated in boldface thus; deletions indicated in brackets [thus]).

10:87-6.15[(a)2](b) [Rounding:] In calculating net monthly income, the amounts shall be rounded down to whole dollar amounts by dropping all cents. Such rounding shall occur before and after each calculation, except for the computation of medical and shelter costs. For example, any cents in gross weekly earnings shall be dropped prior to the application of the weekly conversion factor. [i]1. Rounding of Medical and Shelter Expenses - The individual costs used in Steps 5 and [6] 7 in N.J.A.C. 10:87-6.15(a)1.vi. shall be computed using exact dollars and cents. The cents will be dropped from both the total medical costs and the total shelter costs prior to deducting [the shelter] those costs from the household's [adjusted] income.

Proposed New Rules for Assignment of Employable General Assistance Recipients to Worksites

John J. Horn, Commissioner of Labor and Industry, pursuant to authority of P.L. 1979, c. 267, proposes to adopt new rules concerning the assignment of employable general assistance recipients to worksites for the purpose of working off their public assistance grants as follows.

CHAPTER 35. WORKFARE

SUBCHAPTER 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

12:35-1.1 Title and citation

These rules shall be known and may be cited as N.J.A.C. 12:35-1.1 et seq., Workfare.

12:35-1.2 Reporting requirements; forms

Employable general assistance recipients will report to municipal worksites only after employment service/general assistance employability program staff is in receipt of form 511B and the municipal worksite agreement (MWSA) from the municipal welfare department. Upon receipt of the municipal worksite agreement, employment service staff will notify the municipal welfare director of receipt of such by use of form NJES-1A. General assistance recipients may not be assigned to worksite activities until the ES/GAEP staff has received both form 511B and the signed MWSA.

12:35-1.3 Workers' Compensation coverage requirements

To insure State workers' compensation coverage for all worksite participants in interim worksite assignments (interim being those worksites developed by municipal welfare directors), the municipal worksite agreement must be signed by both the municipal welfare director and the worksite agent (the worksite agent being a paid employee of the agency for whom the worksite activity is being performed and who has the authority from that agency for conducting onsite supervision of participants and maintaining time and attendance reports).

12:35-1.4 Notices

A notice in duplicate will be prepared for each worksite participant and will be signed by the participant. (See Appendix 2.) The notice will inform the participant of his/her worksite schedule (days of the week, hours of work), the wage rate used to determine this schedule, whom to report on the worksite, and the address of the worksite. One copy will be retained by the participant, the other will be kept in the participant's case folder.

12:35-1.5 Attendance and worksite activity monitoring

Attendance and worksite activity for interim worksite assignments developed by municipal welfare directors will be monitored during the two week period by the welfare director or other appropriate municipal welfare staff so designated by the director of the welfare.

12:35-1.6 Interim worksite assignments; evaluations

(a) Interim worksite assignments developed by the municipal welfare director will be monitored and evaluated by the Employment Service within 14 days after the ES has received a MWSA. The interim worksite assignments will be evaluated by ES/GAEP staff based on the following criteria:

1. The individual assigned is capable of performing the duties involved at the worksite.
2. Working conditions are such that they do not represent a substantial risk to the individual's health and safety.
3. The participant has a reasonable means of transportation to the worksite assignment. "Reasonable" shall in this case mean at no cost to the participant.

(b) If any of these criteria is not met, ES staff will inform the welfare director through use of form 1A that the participant is being reassigned immediately. Reassignment may include orientation, job search, active registrant pool, or another worksite assignment if such is available. Failure to comply with ES/GAEP recommendations for reassignment will lead to the municipality's assumption of responsibility for liability coverage on that worksite.

SUBCHAPTER 2. LOCATION OF WORKSITE ACTIVITY

12:34-2.1 Establishment of worksite assignments; municipalities

Worksite assignments may be established by the municipal welfare director in the performance of work for the municipality or a non-profit agency or institution pursuant to a contract with the municipality.

12:35-2.1 Establishment of worksite assignments; employment service

Worksite assignments may be established by the employment service in the performance of work for county, or State agencies as well as municipal agencies, non-profit agencies and institutions.

12:35-2.3 Worksites in appropriate municipality

Efforts by either the employment service or municipal welfare director will be made to develop worksites in the municipality where the employable general assistance recipient receives his/her public assistance grant.

12:35-2.4 Unavailability of worksites in certain municipalities

If worksites are not available in the municipality where an employable general assistance recipient receives his/her public assistance grant, the municipal welfare director will immediately notify the appropriate employment service staff, and worksite development will become the responsibility of the employment service.

SUBCHAPTER 3. SCHEDULING WORKSITE ASSIGNMENTS

12:35-3.1 Hours of work

Persons assigned to a worksite by either NJES or the MWD shall work only the number of hours equal to the amount of their grant divided by an hourly wage rate commensurate with beginning regular employees similarly employed.

12:35-3.2 Determination of prevailing wage rate

In such cases where there are no beginning regular employees similarly employed, the NJES or the MWD will contact the local labor market analyst in the department and determine the prevailing wage rate for that particular worksite assignment. This hourly wage rate will be recorded as part of the municipal worksite agreement.

SUBCHAPTER 4. TYPES OF WORK ALLOWABLE UNDER WORKSITE ACTIVITIES

12:35-4.1 Type of work to be performed

The type of work to be performed by an employable general assistance recipient will be based upon an assessment of the individual's employment capabilities and the service needs of the municipality. Whenever possible, worksites will permit an individual to utilize and/or enhance his/her employment capabilities in order to maximize that individual's chances of obtaining unsubsidized employment.

12:35-4.2 Prohibition on replacing or displacing regular employees

Worksite assignments will not result in either the replacement or displacement of regular employees.

After all reasonable means to obtain a meter reading have been exhausted, the company may discontinue service provided at least eight months have passed since the last meter reading was obtained, the Board of Public Utility Commissioners have been so notified and the customer has been properly notified by prior mailing. If service is discontinued and subsequently restored, the utility may charge a reconnection charge equal to the reconnection charge for restoring service after discontinuance for nonpayment.

Proposed Amendments to the Administrative Procedures of Purchase Bureau

Clifford A. Goldman, State Treasurer, pursuant to authority of N.J.S.A. 52:34-12, proposes to amend N.J.A.C. 17:12-1.1, 17:12-2.4, 17:12-2.5, 17:12-2.7, 17:12-2.8, and 17:12-3.3 of the administrative procedures for the Purchase Bureau. The proposed amendments are an attempt to clarify confusing regulations, eliminate those that are outmoded and add formalized regulations now in use but not previously promulgated in the Code.

Full text of the proposed amendments follows (additions indicated in boldface thus; deletions indicated in brackets [thus]).

17:12-1.1(d) The director may authorize the signing of purchase orders on his behalf for such amounts as he may establish from time to time.

17:12-2.4(a)3. Failure to return a [manufacturer's certificate, statement of origin or] certificate of insurance. [These items] **This certificate of insurance may be accepted prior to issuance of a contract or purchase order provided that the vendor expresses his intent to do so in the bid proposal.**

17:12-2.5(a)6. Failure to initial price alterations: If a unit price in the bid has been altered [by any method, for example by being crossed out and reentered, or through erasure, use of correction fluid, or use of a self-correcting typewriter and so forth,] the vendor's initials must appear adjacent to the alteration. **Examples of alterations include, but are not limited to, cross-outs and erasures, with reentered prices.** If the alteration has not been so initialed, that particular item only in the bid will be automatically rejected, except as follows: if the extended price is correct and does not contain alterations, it shall be considered the bid price. If the extended total price does not contain alterations and the altered unit price is not initialed, the extended total price is considered as the bid price. In the event of an automatic rejection, and when the bid contains multiple items, the remainder of the bid will be evaluated;

7. [If a bid is submitted in pencil;] **If information essential to a bid evaluation, including but not limited to, price, terms, and product description is submitted in pencil; provided, however, that the bid may not be rejected if the same essential information appears elsewhere in the bid, either typewritten or printed, and provided further that the information is entirely consistent with the information submitted in pencil and does not invite any other interpretation.**

17:12-2.7(e) Notwithstanding the 30 day cancellation clause in contracts issued by the Division, the Director shall:

1. **Cancel any contract without delay upon the discovery**

of an error in the bid evaluation which led to an erroneous award. It is not the intent of this provision to reconsider the Director's business judgment in making an award. Cancellation under this provision shall occur only upon discovery of a gross or obvious error, apparent in a written evaluation or after a review of the bid documents, including, but not limited to, an erroneous computation, an award to a vendor who failed to meet mandatory requirements, or an erroneous determination that a vendor failed to meet mandatory requirements. The Director shall document the error and promptly notify all parties.

2. **Void those contracts or purchase orders which were signed on his behalf in excess of the amount authorized.**

17:12-2.8(b) A bid is "read" at the formal opening when the vendor's name and total price is announced. Each individual price need not be read aloud. After the opening, all parties will be given an opportunity, under appropriate security measures as established by the Director, to review the bids.

17:12-3.3 Requests for hearings, hearing procedures, time limitations

(a) Any vendor or interested bidder requesting a hearing: [under the provisions of this act]

1. **Must make written request to the Director, Division of Purchase and Property setting forth the specific grounds for challenging the award. This notice must be submitted within 10 days after written notification that his bid has not been accepted or that an award of contract has been made. If no written notice of award is provided, the request for hearing must be made within a reasonable time.**

2. **Hearings which are not under the jurisdiction of the Office of Administrative Law shall be informal and held, where feasible, within 14 days. Hearings will be heard, where practicable, by an impartial hearing officer. The hearing officer shall prepare a report to the Director within 10 days of the conclusion of the hearing unless, due to the circumstances of the hearing, a greater time is required. The hearing report shall be advisory in nature and is not binding on the Director. All parties shall receive a copy of the hearing officer's report and have 10 days to provide written comments or exceptions to the Director. Subsequent to the 10 day period for exceptions, the Director, Division of Purchase and Property, shall make a final judgment on the matter;**

3. **No change.**

4. **Hearings in those matters which are contested cases as defined pursuant to N.J.A.C. 19:66-1.1 shall be held under the jurisdiction of the Office of Administrative Law except in those cases where the Director or the head of the agency reserves the right to hear the case in person. The judge designated by the Office of Administrative Law shall prepare a report to the Director within 45 days of the conclusion of the hearing. The hearing report shall be advisory in nature and is not binding on the Director. All parties shall receive a copy of the hearing officer's report and have 10 days from the date of receipt of this report by the Division to provide this agency with written comments or exceptions to the Director. The Director may shorten this exception period based on exigent circumstances. Subsequent to the 10 day period for exceptions, the Director, Division of Purchase and Property, shall make a final judgment in the matter which shall be rendered no later than 45 days from the date he received a copy of the hearing report. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14-14B-10, failure to modify or reject the hearing report will result in the adoption of the decision of the administrative law judge as the final decision of the head of the agency.**

Proposed Amendments Concerning Corporation Business Tax Act And Method of Computing Tax; Net Income Base

Sidney Glaser, Director of the Division of Taxation in the Department of the Treasury, pursuant to authority of N.J.S.A. 54:10A-1 et seq., proposes to amend N.J.A.C. 18:7-3.6 concerning the Corporation Business Tax Act and the method of computing tax and net income base.

Full text of the proposal follows (additions indicated in boldface thus; deletions indicated in brackets [thus]).

18:7-3.6 Method of computing part two of tax; net income base

[(a) A tax under Part Two of the New Jersey Corporation Tax is measured at the rate of 7½ per cent upon a corporation's entire net income or such portion thereof as may be allocated to New Jersey.]

(a) P.L. 1979, Chapter 280, has increased the rate on the corporate adjusted net income to nine per cent under the Corporation Business Tax Act effective as of January 1, 1980.

1. The increased rate will apply to all accounting periods ending after December 31, 1979. For all corporations subject to the Corporation Business Tax Act, including banking corporations, which have a fiscal year ending on December 31, 1979, the net income tax rate continues at 7½ per cent for the tax payable in the calendar year 1980. Any taxpayers having other than a calendar year accounting period must apportion their income for that portion of the number of months of their accounting period in 1979 at the 7½ per cent rate and apportion the number of months of their accounting period in the calendar year 1980 at the 9 per cent rate. In the alternative, taxpayers may use the composite rates applicable to the appropriate fiscal year ending as outlined in these regulations.

2. Calendar year companies will pay the new corporate net income tax rate of nine per cent based on their accounting year ending December 31, 1980.

(b) The tax rate on net income for any part of taxpayer's accounting period prior to January 1, 1980, is 7½ per cent. For the portion of the accounting period on and after January 1, 1980 the tax rate has been increased to nine per cent. Taxpayer should compute its tax by consulting the numbered paragraphs below:

1. Where the report covers a calendar year or part of the fiscal period ending after December 31, 1979, the net income tax rate is nine per cent.

2. For all full 12 month fiscal periods ending in 1980 after December 31, 1979, taxpayer may compute its tax based on net income by using the method prescribed at paragraph 4 of this subsection or by consulting the effective net income tax rates below:

Accounting Periods Ending	Tax Rate
January 31, 1980	7.625%
February 29, 1980	7.750%
March 31, 1980	7.875%
April 30, 1980	8.000%
May 31, 1980	8.125%
June 30, 1980	8.250%
July 31, 1980	8.375%
August 31, 1980	8.500%
September 30, 1980	8.625%
October 31, 1980	8.750%
November 30, 1980	8.875%
December 31, 1980	9.000%

3. For all fiscal periods beginning on or after January 1, 1980, the net income tax rate is nine per cent.

4. For all full 12 month fiscal periods ending in 1980 after December 31, 1979, not using the applicable effective net income tax rates set forth above, and for short period returns (commencing in 1979 and ending in 1980) not covered by paragraphs 1 or 3 of this subsection, net income tax liability must be computed on the basis provided by the statutory amendment which is reprinted in its entirety below:

i. Where the accounting or privilege period covered by a report includes any period prior to January 1, 1980, then:

(1) Tentative taxes on taxable net income shall be separately computed by applying both the rate for the period before January 1, 1980, and the rate for the period on and after such date to the taxable income for the entire accounting or privilege period; and

(2) The tax for such accounting or privilege period shall be the sum of that proportion of each tentative tax which the number of months in each period bears to the total number of months in the entire accounting or privilege period. For the purposes of this computation, more than one-half the number of days in a calendar month shall be deemed to be a full month.

ii. Computation of the net income tax base is made in the manner indicated below (two parts):

(1) Period prior to January 1, 1980: Tax base multiplied by the tax rate of .075, the product divided by the total number of months in the accounting period, multiplied by the number of months prior to January 1, 1980; this result equals the tentative tax liability for the period before January 1, 1980,

or

tax base X .075 X months prior to January 1, 1980 = tentative tax liability
months in period

(2) Period after January 1, 1980: Tax base multiplied by the tax rate of .090, the product divided by the total number of months in the accounting period, multiplied by the number of months subsequent to January 1, 1980; this result equals the tentative tax liability for the period after January 1, 1980,

or

tax base X .090 X months after January 1, 1980 = tentative tax liability
months in period

(3) Add the two parts, the tentative tax liability for the period before January 1, 1980, plus the tentative tax liability for the period after January 1, 1980, to determine the total tax liability before computation of the prepayment.

(c) For a foreign corporation acquiring a taxable status in New Jersey on or after January 1, 1980, and filing its New Jersey return on a short period basis, the tax rate is nine per cent on adjusted entire net income after proper proration.

[(b)] (d) There is no minimum net income tax.

SUBCHAPTER 9. MORATORIUM ON TAXATION OF MOBILE HOMES AS REAL PROPERTY

18:12-9.1 Mobile home assessed and taxed prior to and on March 20, 1979

Any mobile home assessed and taxed as real property prior to and on March 20, 1979, for which no appeal has been taken on the imposition of a real property tax as of said date, shall continue to be assessed and taxed as real property.

18:12-9.2 Mobile home not assessed and taxed as real property prior to and on March 20, 1979

Any mobile home that was not assessed and taxed as real property prior to and on March 20, 1979, shall not be assessed and taxed as real property until October 1, 1980, for the tax year 1981.

18:12-9.3 Mobile home acquired after March 20, 1979; located in mobile home park

Any mobile home located after March 20, 1979, in any mobile home park in which mobile homes were not assessed and taxed as real property prior to and on March 20, 1979, for which no appeal has been taken on the imposition of real property tax as of said date, shall not be assessed and taxed as real property until October 1, 1980, for the tax year 1981.

18:12-9.4 Mobile home acquired after March 20, 1979; not located in mobile home park

Mobile homes acquired after March 20, 1979, and not located in any mobile home park shall be assessed and taxed as all other real property in the taxing district.

18:12-9.5 Mobile home not subject to added or omitted assessment

During the period of the moratorium and for the tax years 1978, 1979 and 1980, no mobile home subject to the moratorium shall be assessed as an added or omitted assessment and taxed as real property.

18:12-9.6 Expiration date of moratorium

(a) This moratorium expires on October 1, 1980, at which time mobile homes shall be assessed and taxed as real property for the tax year 1981.

(b) As to the implementation of the moratorium on taxation of mobile homes, see P.L. 1979, c. 366 (approved February 4, 1980).

Sidney Glaser, Director of the Division of Taxation in the Department of the Treasury, pursuant to authority of N.J.S.A. 54:32B-1 et seq., proposes to adopt new rules concerning taxation of mobile homes through December 31, 1980.

Full text of the proposal follows.

18:24-7.19 Taxation of mobile homes through December 31, 1980

(a) This section is to clarify the taxation of mobile homes for sales tax purposes through December 31, 1980, pursuant to P.L. 1979, c. 366 (approved February 4, 1980) which established a moratorium on the taxation of mobile homes.

(b) The sale of any mobile home made on or after March 20, 1979, is subject to sales tax through December 31, 1980, as a motor vehicle as defined in subsection (v) of section 2 of the New Jersey Sales and Use Tax Act (N.J.S.A. 54:32B-2(v)) as was the case prior to March 20, 1979.

(c) Excepted from sales tax as provided in subsection (b) of this section:

1. The sale of any mobile home assessed and taxed as real property pursuant to the moratorium on taxation of mobile homes for local property tax purposes; and

2. The sale of a new or previously unused-mobile home which shall be subject to sales tax only to the extent of the taxation of the sale of tangible personal property for building construction used in erecting structures or building on or otherwise improving real property, as provided under subsection (e)(2)(A) of section 2 of the Sales and Use Tax Act (N.J.S.A. 54:32B-2(e)(2)(A)).

(d) For purposes of subsection (c)2 of this section, the subsequent sale of a mobile home which has not been assessed and taxed as real property shall be subject to sales tax as provided in subsection (b) of this section.

(e) This section is to implement the moratorium on taxation of mobile homes and for sales tax purposes shall expire on December 31, 1980.

Proposed Amendments Concerning Coin-Operated Vending Machines And Appropriate Sales Tax

Sidney Glaser, Director of the Division of Taxation in the Department of the Treasury, pursuant to authority of N.J.S.A. 54:32B-1 et seq., proposes to amend certain sections in subchapter 16, chapter 24, in Title 18 of the New Jersey Administrative Code concerning the sales tax regarding coin-operated vending machines and the sales of tangible personal property and the sales of food and drink.

Full text of the proposal follows (additions indicated in boldface thus; deletions indicated in brackets [thus]).

SUBCHAPTER 16. COIN-OPERATED VENDING MACHINES; SALES OF TANGIBLE PERSONAL PROPERTY; SALES OF FOOD AND DRINK

30 per cent of receipts from food and beverage sales (30 per cent x \$8,000)	2,400
Receipts subject to tax	\$ 5,600
Tax Due (@ 5 per cent)	\$ 280

18:24-16.1 Tax of vending machine sales generally

In general, receipts from sales of taxable tangible personal property and receipts as defined in subsection (c) of section 6 of these rules from sales of taxable food and drink are subject to the New Jersey Sales Tax even though the tax is not reimbursed to the vendor by the purchaser where such sales are in the amount of less than \$0.11.

18:24-16.2 Registration to operate vending machines

Vendors operating vending machines in the State of New Jersey must register with the New Jersey [Sales Tax Bureau] Division of Taxation to engage legally in the business of selling tangible personal property at retail, including also, food and drink of a kind the receipts from which are subject to the sales tax.

18:24-16.5 Vendor's records; contents

(a) Adequate records must be kept by the vendor, showing:

1. The location or locations of each machine operated by him;
2. The serial number of each machine operated by him;
3. Purchases and inventories by physical units of merchandise bought for sale through all such machines;
4. The unit [proces] prices charged by the vendor;
5. The gross receipts derived from the operation of each machine at each location, or the gross receipts derived from the sale of like products at each location;
6. The receipts from exempt sales;
7. The cost of all tangible personal property, food and drink which the vendor purchased for resale; and
8. The cost of all supplies of which the vendor is deemed to be the ultimate consumer.

18:24-16.6 Tax on gross receipts

(a) Vendors operating vending machines which dispense tangible personal property, [including, also,] other than food and drink, must report and pay to the State the tax upon the gross receipts from all sales of such items made through such machines, subject to the exemptions set forth in the Sales and Use Tax Act[...] such as cigarettes (exempt under N.J.S.A. 54:32B-8(y)) and items sold through vending machines for \$0.10 or less (exempt under N.J.S.A. 54:32B-8(i) and subchapter 17 of this chapter).

(b) Effective January 3, 1980 (P.L. 1979, c. 274), vendors operating vending machines which dispense food and beverage must report and pay to the State the tax upon vending machine sales as defined in subsection (c) below from all sales of such items made through such machines subject to the exemptions set forth in subsections (b) and (c) of section 7 of these rules.

(c) For purposes of subsection (b) above, taxable vending machine sales means the wholesale price of food and beverage which is 70 per cent of the retail vending machine selling price of such food and beverage.

(d) Taxpayers must report total receipts from all vending machine sales and deductions of all non-taxable items including 30 per cent of sales of food and drink.

(e) Example: Total receipts from all vending machine sales	\$10,000
Less deductions:	
Cigarettes	\$1,000
Milk	1,000
	2,000
	\$8,000

18:24-6.7 Tax exemptions

(a) Receipts from sales of food or drink exempted from the tax by subsection 8(b) [N.J.S.A. 54:32B-8(b)] are not allowable deductions from gross receipts derived from sales through vending machines.

(b) [There is no exemption for items subject to tax pursuant to subsection 3(c), such as carbonated beverages, hot drinks, sandwiches, and other prepared foods.] Receipts from the sale of food and drink sold through vending machines in a cafeteria of an elementary or secondary school or to students in an eating facility of an institution of higher education, fraternity, sorority and eating club operated in connection with an institution of higher education are exempt from tax only when located within such cafeteria or eating facility. Receipts from sales of food and drink through vending machines located in areas not designed by an institution of higher education as an eating facility, other than a cafeteria or eating facility, are subject to tax as provided in subsection (c) of section 6 of these rules. For purposes of these rules vending machines located in areas including but not limited to student lounges, dormitories, gymnasiums, libraries, etc., are not deemed located in an eating facility.

(c) In all instances the receipts from the sale of milk through vending machines are exempt from tax.

On February 7, 1980, Gloria Decker, Executive Director of the Lottery Commission in the Department of the Treasury, pursuant to authority of N.J.S.A. 5:9-7 and in accordance with applicable provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act, adopted emergency amendments to Chapters 20 and 21 in Title 17 of the New Jersey Administrative Code concerning the Lottery Bingo game.

Full text of the adoption follows.

Note: Delete the current text of N.J.A.C. 17:20-5.10, 17:21-1.2, 17:21-2.2(a), 17:21-2.3, 17:21-3.1, 17:21-3.2, 17:21-3.3, 17:21-4.1 through 17:21-4.4, 17:21-5.1, 17:21-5.6, 17:21-5.7 and 17:21-10.1 through 17:21-10.4 and replace these with following new text.

17:20-5.10 Agent's compensation

(a) All licensed manual agents shall be entitled to a commission for the sale of lottery tickets in accordance with the following schedule:

1. Compensation for tickets manually vended: 5.00 per cent;

2. Compensation for tickets machine vended through a coin-actuated machine: 2.50 percent.

(b) All licensed agents, whether they be vending machine agents or manual agents, shall be entitled to a bonus as follows:

1. Weekly lottery:

i. Five hundred dollars to an agent who sells a \$25,000 winning ticket.

(c) All claim centers shall be entitled to compensation for validation and redemption in the amount of \$0.50 per winning lottery ticket entitled to prizes not exceeding \$599.00 unless otherwise stipulated by specific game rules. Also, all claim centers shall be entitled to compensation in the amount of \$0.50 per completed claim form, with winning ticket attached, which is filed with the Lottery Commission in accordance with the procedure for use of claim forms by claim centers.

(d) The Director may establish such sales incentive programs as he deems necessary or desirable for the operation of the State Lottery. The number, duration and form of such programs shall be within the discretion of the Director.

17:21-1.2 (Reserved)

17:21-2.2(a) Each drawing shall be conducted at a location designated by the Director.

17:21-2.3 Weekly drawing pool

The Weekly Lottery numbers selected at the drawing will consist of five two-digit "Bingo" numbers. Each ticket pool for the Weekly Bingo Lottery shall contain 759,375 tickets and the prize structure shall be based on such a pool.

17:21-3.1 Manner of conducting Weekly Drawing

(a) Each Weekly Drawing shall be conducted and the winners determined as hereinafter provided:

1. Five two-digit "Bingo" numbers shall be randomly selected.

2. There shall be 75 "Bingo" balls each bearing the numbers 01 through 75 inclusive.

3. There shall be five mixers each containing the 15 appropriate "Bingo" balls.

4. Mixer "B" shall contain the numbered balls 01 through 15 inclusive.

i. Mixer "I" shall contain the numbered balls 16 through 30 inclusive.

ii. Mixer "N" shall contain the numbered balls 31 through 45 inclusive.

iii. Mixer "G" shall contain the numbered balls 46 through 60 inclusive.

iv. Mixer "O" shall contain the numbered balls 61 through 75 inclusive.

5. After rotating the mixers, the Lottery shall draw one numbered ball at random from each mixer, starting with mixer "B" and sequentially concluding with mixer "O."

6. As each numbered ball is selected from its respective mixer, it shall prominently be displayed under its appropriate "BINGO" letter.

7. In the event that the Weekly Lottery Bingo drawing cannot be conducted as prescribed in N.J.A.C. 17:21-3.1(a), the Executive Director shall have the authority to determine an alternate drawing procedure.

17:21-3.2 Number and amount of prizes

(a) For each Lottery pool of 759,375 tickets, the following

(b) In addition to the prize structure set forth herein, incentive prize award bonuses shall be awarded to the lottery agents as per the following:

1. Bonus to agent selling the winning \$25,000 Weekly Bingo Prize ticket \$500.00.

(c) The difference between the total amount of money available for awarding as cash prizes and 49.19 per cent of the total revenues generated from the sale of lottery tickets in each lottery pool may be allocated to a fund for appropriation to the prize pool of past or future weekly lotteries, the next ensuing millionaire lottery, or as otherwise directed by the Lottery Commission.

17:21-3.3 Determination of prize winners

(a) For each weekly lottery pool of 759,375 tickets, there shall be offered 54,241 cash prizes, as fully described in N.J.A.C. 17:21-3.2.

(b) The winner of a prize shall be entitled only to the award of the largest prize for which he is eligible, as evidenced by his winning numbers. He shall be eliminated from lesser awards in the same drawing.

17:21-4.1 Places of claiming

(a) The Lottery prize structure provides cash prize tiers of \$2.00, \$10.00, \$50.00, \$1,000.00, and \$25,000.00.

(b) The claim centers are duly authorized to accept claims on all prize tiers, and are also authorized to pay all claims of \$2.00, \$10.00 and \$50.00.

(c) All duly authorized Lottery Agents (non-claim centers) are authorized to pay claims of \$2.00 only.

(d) The Director shall designate claim centers for the lottery program and advertise their locations.

17:21-4.2 Claim form

(a) The claimant is required to fill out the claim form which is obtained from the claim center and present the completed form together with the "winning" ticket to any claim center; provided, however, that the Director may, in his discretion, authorize the cash redemption of certain prizes upon presentation and proper validation of a winning ticket at certain designated locations.

(b) The Director may, in his discretion, require a verification on the claim form that the person claiming a prize is not an officer or employee of the Division of the State Lottery or a person prohibited from claiming a prize.

17:21-4.3 Winning number list

The State Lottery will provide the claim centers and lottery agents with a list for all winning numbers for the 52 previous weeks.

17:21-4.4 Claim center verification

(a) Except in those situations where the Director has authorized cash redemption, the claim center will verify the claim, herein described, and if acceptable, deliver one copy of the claim form to the claimant.

(b) The claim center will forward the winning ticket and a copy of the claim form to the State Lottery for validation.

(c) Upon validation by the State Lottery, a check will be awarded to the claimant in payment of the amount due.

(d) In the event that the claim is not valid, the claim shall be denied and the claimant shall be promptly notified.

No application shall be permitted to be withdrawn, however, unless the applicant shall have first established to the satisfaction of the commission that withdrawal of the application would be consistent with the public interest and the policies of the act. The commission shall have the authority to direct that any applicant so permitted to withdraw his application shall not be eligible to apply again for licensure, registration or approval until after the expiration of one year from the date of such withdrawal. Unless the commission shall otherwise direct, no fee or other payment relating to any application shall become refundable by reason of withdrawal of the application.

(b) Where a hearing on an application has been requested by a party or directed by the commission, the commission shall not permit withdrawal of said application after:

1. The application matter has been transmitted to the Office of Administrative Law; or
2. The application matter has been assigned to any other hearing examiner authorized by law to hear such matter; or
3. The commission has made a determination to hear the application matter directly.

(c) Notwithstanding the foregoing, the commission may accept and consider a written notice of withdrawal after the time specified herein if the division consents to withdrawal and if the commission is satisfied that there exist extraordinary circumstances justifying withdrawal.

Proposed Rules on Reapplication by Natural Persons

Joseph P. Lordi, Chairman of the New Jersey Casino Control Commission, pursuant to authority of N.J.S.A. 5:12-1 et seq., proposes to adopt new rules concerning the reapplication by natural persons.

Full text of the proposal follows.

19:41-8.8 Reapplication by natural person after denial or revocation

(a) Any natural person required to be licensed, qualified or approved under the provisions of the act or regulations of the Commission whose licensure, qualification, or approval is either denied or revoked by the Commission on the basis of that person's failure to satisfy the affirmative qualification criteria of the act, or due to a Commission finding that such person is disqualified under the criteria of section 86 of the act, or both, may not, except as other-

wise provided in subsections (b), (f) and (g) of this section, reapply for licensure, qualification or approval until five years have elapsed from the date of said denial or revocation.

(b) Any natural person whose licensure, qualification or approval is denied or revoked by the Commission on the basis of any of the following enumerated provisions of the act or regulations of the Commission may reapply, in accordance with the procedure set forth in subsection (c) of this section, for licensure, qualification or approval upon satisfaction of the conditions specified herein:

1. Lack of financial stability pursuant to sections 89(b)1, 90(b) or 91(b) of the act: Reapplication is permitted upon said person achieving status of financial stability.

2. Lack of business ability and casino experience pursuant to sections 89(b)(3) or 90(b) of the act: Reapplication is permitted upon said person acquiring the requisite business ability and casino experience.

3. Failure to satisfy residency requirement pursuant to sections 89(b)(4), 90(b) and 91(b) of the act, and/or N.J. A.C. 19:41-4.3: Reapplication is permitted upon said person actually establishing residency as required or upon a Commission finding of sufficient intent to establish such residency.

4. Failure to satisfy age requirement pursuant to N.J. A.C. 19:41-1.3: Reapplication is permitted upon said person attaining the requisite age or upon a Commission finding that such age will be attained prior to the completion of the processing of said reapplication.

5. Conviction of statutory disqualifier pursuant to section 86(c) of the act: If reapplication is to be evaluated under the standards of sections 90 or 91 of the act, reapplication is permitted after the lapse of five years from the date of denial or revocation, or upon the issuance of a judicial order of expungement or sealing, whichever occurs first. If reapplication is to be evaluated under the standards of section 89 of the act, reapplication is permitted after the lapse of 10 years from the date of conviction, or upon the issuance of a judicial order of expungement or sealing, whichever occurs first.

6. Prosecution or pending charge related to statutory disqualifier pursuant to section 86(d) of the act: Reapplication is permitted upon the disposition of the prosecution or pending charge against said person.

7. Acts constituting a section 86(c) offense pursuant to section 86(g) of the act: If reapplication is to be evaluated under the standards of sections 90 or 91 of the act, reapplication is governed by the provisions of subsection (a) of this section. If reapplication is to be evaluated under the standards of section 89 of the act, reapplication is permitted after the lapse of ten years from the date of the conduct in question.

(c) Any natural person whose licensure, qualification, or approval has been denied or revoked on the basis of one or more of the enumerated statutory and regulatory provisions set forth in subsection (b) of this section may reapply for such licensure, qualification or approval as follows:

1. Prior to reapplication, said person shall submit to the Chairman of the Casino Control Commission a verified petition, with supporting affidavits, requesting that such reapplication be permitted, and showing with particularity the satisfaction of the condition precedent to reapplication specified in subsection (b) of this section.

2. The Chairman shall have the authority to either summarily deny the petition or to grant the petition and issue an order authorizing reapplication by said person.

3. If the Chairman denies the petition, said person may appeal this determination in writing to the full Com-

mission within 45 days of denial, said appeal to be considered and determined by the Commission within 45 days of the receipt of the notice of appeal by the Commission.

4. The Chairman shall grant the petition only upon a showing that the condition precedent specified in subsection (b) of this section has been satisfied in accordance with the provisions of this regulation.

(d) If the licensure, qualification or approval of any natural person has been denied or revoked on the basis of two or more statutory or regulatory provisions, reapplication shall only be permitted upon compliance with the requirements of this regulation as to each statutory or regulatory provision which the Commission found to be a basis for such denial or revocation.

(e) This regulation applies with equal force and effect to the denial or revocation of any application by a natural person for licensure, qualification or approval, and to any denial or revocation of any reapplication for licensure, qualification or approval permitted under the provisions of this regulation.

(f) Any person whose licensure, qualification or approval has been denied or revoked on the basis of any statutory or regulatory provision which has been subsequently repealed or modified in such a manner so as to obviate the grounds for such denial or revocation may petition the Chairman, in accordance with the procedures set forth in subsection (c) of this section, to be permitted to reapply. The petition shall specify with particularity the repeal or modification of the statutory or regulatory provision at issue and the circumstances of the prior denial or revocation which warrant the allowance of such reapplication. The Chairman shall grant the petition only upon a showing that the repeal or modification of the statutory or regulatory provision which was the basis of such denial or revocation justifies the conclusion that there would be a reasonable likelihood that the Commission would alter its previous decision.

(g) Any natural person whose licensure, qualification or approval has been denied or revoked and who is barred from reapplication for five years by subsection (a), (b)5 or (b)7 of this section may petition the Chairman to permit early reapplication at any time. The petition shall be verified and supported by affidavits and shall include written argument for the relief sought. It shall state with particularity any grounds upon which revocation or denial was based, and the facts and circumstances which warrant early reapplication. Upon receipt of such petition, the Chairman shall offer the Division an opportunity to state its position in writing. Based upon the petition and any written submission from the Division, the Chairman may either:

1. Summarily deny the petition; or
2. Grant the petition if he finds that there exist extraordinary facts and circumstances warranting early reapplication.
