New Online Business Resources Are Here

The State Library is pleased to provide state employees with access to four new business databases. Use your State Library card to access them from your home or office.

Go to: [Cyberdesk](#) then click on [Databases by Title](#).

- **[RDS Business & Industry](#)**: Focuses on facts, figures, events and market information about companies, industries, products and markets. Covers all industries and is international in scope.
- **[RDS Business & Management Practices](#)**: Focuses on the processes, methods and strategies of managing a business. Emphasizes the practical side of business and management with real-life applications, case studies and how-to guidelines.
- **[RDS TableBase](#)**: Provides tabular data on companies, industries, products, demographics and other key business information. Covers over 90 industries and is international in scope.
- **[Small Business Resource Center](#)**: Provides information on such key topics as financing, financial planning, business plan creation, market analysis, sales strategy, and tax planning. Includes current topics, tips and strategies from a combination of content, including full-text periodicals, news sources, reference books, and links to websites focusing exclusively on small business topics. You can also link to state-specific, professionally created legal forms in a variety of subject areas.

New E-Books Provide Access to Reference Titles From Your Home or Office


Your State Library card now gives you access to reference books electronically. Traditionally, reference books had to be used in the library. With our e-book collection you can select encyclopedias, dictionaries and other reference titles remotely by going to [CyberDesk](#) and clicking on [Databases by Title](#). The databases you can access are:

[Gale Virtual Reference Library](#) contains 90 e-reference books, which cover business, education, the environment, history, medicine, religion, science and social science. The titles can be searched individually or all at once. You can find sample business plans, access *West's Encyclopedia of American Law*, and view specialized encyclopedias. Titles of interest include *Performance Management and Budgeting: How Governments Can Learn from Experience*, *Encyclopedia of Group Processes and Intergroup Relations* and *The Gale Encyclopedia of Surgery and Medical Tests*.

[Net Library](#) contains some reference material. A Net Library account is required to view the full text content remotely. See our [e-books](#) web page for more information. Titles of note: *Accountants' Handbook*, *United States Gubernatorial Elections, 1776-1860: the Official Results by State and County*; *United States Presidential Elections, 1788-1860: The Official Results by County and State*.

[Oxford Reference Online Premium](#) includes more than 175 reference titles such as the *Oxford Companions* and *Oxford Dictionaries series*, the *Visual English Dictionary*, the *Oxford Dictionary of Quotations*, as well as illustrated natural history titles such as the *Encyclopedia of Mammals*. It contains more than 1.4 million entries, including in-depth signed entries with bibliographies, full-color maps and illustrations, timelines, and web links. There are English and bilingual dictionaries, dictionaries of quotations, subject dictionaries and encyclopedias – everything from quick definitions to in-depth articles. Subjects covered include art, economics, food, history, politics, religion and science.


January 19
