

## **AMERICAN COMMUNITY SURVEY RESULTS AVAILABLE ONLINE**


Interested in obtaining up-to-date information about the social and economic needs of local communities? The American Community Survey (ACS) shows how people live - our education, housing, jobs and more. The results of the ACS are designed to help state governments make vital economic and business decisions for our communities. Best of all, the data is readily accessible from your computer.

The survey data should not be confused with the 2010 Census data that will continue to be released in 2011. The ACS is mailed to a random sample of addresses on a monthly basis. The 2010 Census forms are sent to every household in the country every 10 years.

ACS data is released annually to the public, but is also available in 3 and 5 year estimates to include smaller geographies. Released on December 14, 2010, the ACS 5 year estimates are based on data collected from January 1, 2005 to December 31, 2009. Estimates are available for every state, county, city, town, place, American Indian area, Alaska Native area and Hawaiian home land as well as for census tracts and block groups. You can now locate social, economic, housing and demographic statistics for every community in the nation.
