The State Library offers you two great resources for finding industry and company information: [First Research](#) and [Hoover's Online](#).

[First Research](#) provides industry profiles to help marketers, business owners, job seekers and researchers. Covering more than 300 business sectors and highlighting industry trends, each industry profile contains:

- Trends and opportunities
- Business challenges
- Executive insight
- Call preparation questions
- Financial information
- Industry forecast and rating
- Web links and acronyms

Select the *state and provinces* tag from the initial screen and access local industry and economic insight, employment and real estate trends and resource links for each of the 50 states, Washington, DC, and 10 Canadian provinces.

[Hoover's Online](#) provides in-depth company information and business search tools. To get the most comprehensive look at an industry, compliment company information from [Hoover's Online](#) with industry trends and development from [First Research](#). You'll see how companies compare to the industry as a whole.

VIDEO TUTORIAL MAKES FINDING NEW JERSEY LAWS EASY



STATE LIBRARY MATERIALS LINKED IN *GOOGLE SCHOLAR*

Do you like using [Google Scholar](#) to find an interesting abstract or citation? Have you ever wished you could have access to the complete document? You can set your preferences to show you when an article is available through the New Jersey State Library.

Go to the [Google Scholar](#) page. Click on "Scholar Preferences;" go to "Library Links." Type *New Jersey State Library*. Check both boxes for the New Jersey State Library. Save your preferences. Now when you search, Google Scholar looks for the State Library's subscription materials and provides special links to them in your search results. The results from the New Jersey State Library come from either *EbscoHost* or *Academic OneFile*. If you're doing this at work or home, clicking on the *EbscoHost* or *Academic OneFile* link will take you to a page asking for your State Library card number. Put in the number and you have access to the article.



To the left you'll see an example of a Google Scholar page listing articles from the New Jersey State Library through Academic OneFile and EbscoHost.
