## USE *ILLIAD* TO REQUEST BOOKS AND MORE

**A**re you looking for a specific article, book or thesis? To get what you need, use your N.J. State Library card and *ILLiad*.

*ILLiad* is a convenient online request system available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. You can place requests as well as track them from start to finish.

To register for ILLiad, have your N.J. State Library bar code handy and go to <http://illiad.njstatelib.org>.

- Click on "First Time User"
- Read the first time user page
- Enter your bar code in the acceptance space at the bottom of the page
- Click on "first time users click here," which will take you to the new user registration form
- Complete the registration form and click submit.


*You don't have to know where to find that book or article you need, just put your request into ILLiad and library staff will find it for you.*

Now anytime you have a new request or you wish to check on one you've already made, go to <http://illiad.org>, and enter your library card bar code and your password. The main menu will appear. It offers you the option to place various types of requests or to review requests you've already placed. Provide the necessary information about the item you are requesting. Library staff obtain the item and you are notified when it arrives.


*Bring your lunch and hear about New Jersey from its primitive past to the present. The book has dozens of fascinating stories from long-buried mastodons to menacing Martians.*

For nonprofits, searching for information about grants and grantmakers can be confusing and time consuming. Analyzing all of the relevant facts and determining whether or not a match exists between the nonprofit and the funder can be difficult.

The State Library offers not only resources in print and online to assist with this search, but also offers tips and tricks to help funding researchers who do not know where to start. The blog is updated weekly and includes suggestions for working with records gathered from FDOP, ways to search for information, and web sites for extending research.
